LINCOLN, Neb. – Approximately 25 members of the Nebraska Air National Guard's 155th Security Forces Squadron will be given a farewell ceremony, Friday, August 10, as the Airmen prepare for a six-month overseas mission in support of Operation Enduring Freedom.

The Airmen – all members of the Lincoln-based 155th Security Forces – will attend the farewell ceremony scheduled to begin at 3 p.m. at the Nebraska Air Base dining facility. The Nebraska National Guard air base is co-located with the Lincoln Municipal Airport.

According to Guard officials, Lt. Gov. Rick Sheehy, Maj. Gen. Roger Lempke and other state, local and military leaders will be on hand for the ceremony.
