LINCOLN, Neb. – Approximately 190 Soldiers assigned to the Nebraska Army National Guard's 600<sup>th</sup> Transportation Company will be formally wished farewell Thursday, May 31, at the State Fair Grounds in Lincoln, Neb., prior to the start of a one-year mobilization for Operation Iraqi Freedom.

According to Guard officials, the unit, which is based in Omaha, will be responsible for conducting transportation and convoy security missions while serving overseas in the Central Command theater of operations. The unit's final destination is not being released at this time.

The farewell ceremony is scheduled to begin at 6 p.m. in the Open Air Auditorium located on the Nebraska State Fair Grounds. Governor Dave Heineman and other Military, state and local leaders are expected to speak.

Due to space constraints, the farewell ceremony is not open to the public.
